Kitsap Forest Adventure Camp is a summer day camp that seeks to introduce young children to the joys of the beautiful forest and creek environments of the Kitsap Forest Theater, located outside of Bremerton. The camp activities include art, music, drama, play, hiking, and exploring the forest, wildlife and creeks of the Kitsap Forest Theater – all centered around the weekly themes (*Forest Magic and Forest Explorers*). Above all else, Adventure Camp is just plain fun. The camp runs for two weeks: July 11th – 15th and July 18th – 22nd and includes campers from the greater Seattle/Tacoma area and the Kitsap peninsula. There is an all camp family dinner and overnight on each Friday night.

Position Description

Kitsap Forest Adventure Camp Lead Staff will help teach and lead the kids at Adventure Camp under the supervision and direction of the camp coordinator and camp director. The main duties of the lead staff are to help keep kids safe and captivated by the camp activities, to share a love and respect for nature and the Kitsap Forest Theater Property, and to interact with kids and supervise them as instructed during camp hours. Responsibilities will include leading games, crafts and activities, providing support and encouragement for each camper, resolving camper conflicts, supervising activity transitions and behavior management and helping set-up and clean-up before and after camp.

Adventure Camp Lead Staff are directly responsible for keeping each youth in their group safe and facilitating a fun and rewarding summer camp experience. We are looking for leaders and role models who can take direction, share a love of working with children in a natural outdoor setting, and are responsible, creative and high energy individuals.

Key Responsibilities

Planning & Preparation

- Become familiar with the planned camp activities
- Help organize and prepare materials for the daily camp activities

Program Delivery

- Teach songs, crafts, games and activities to campers
- Participate as a participant leader during large group or all camp activities
- Ensure Mountaineers Youth Policies and Procedures are followed and adhered to at all times
- Provide a fun and meaningful camp experience for campers under your supervision
- Provide supervision and activities for those riding the ferry

Candidate Requirements

- Minimum age 18
- Knowledge of, desire to work with, and experience working with a variety of populations, including preschool through high-school, youth of varied abilities, diverse ethnicities and diverse socio-economic backgrounds
- Excellent interpersonal skills
- Current CPR & First Aid Certification, Lifeguard Certification preferred
- Ability to pass a national criminal background and sex offender check
- Must attend staff training (July 2022 dates tbd)

Physical Demands:

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 50 pounds. While performing the duties of this Job, the employee will be required stand for extended periods of time while leading youth, and must be able to hike on uneven and hilly terrain. The employee is occasionally required to bend, squat, run or climb as part of duties leading youth.

Compensation and Benefits

This position is for a full-time, seasonal employee. Regular schedule will be 40+ hours a week, including camp hours. Compensation is \$17 per hour. Benefits include membership in The Mountaineers (www.Mountaineers.org).
