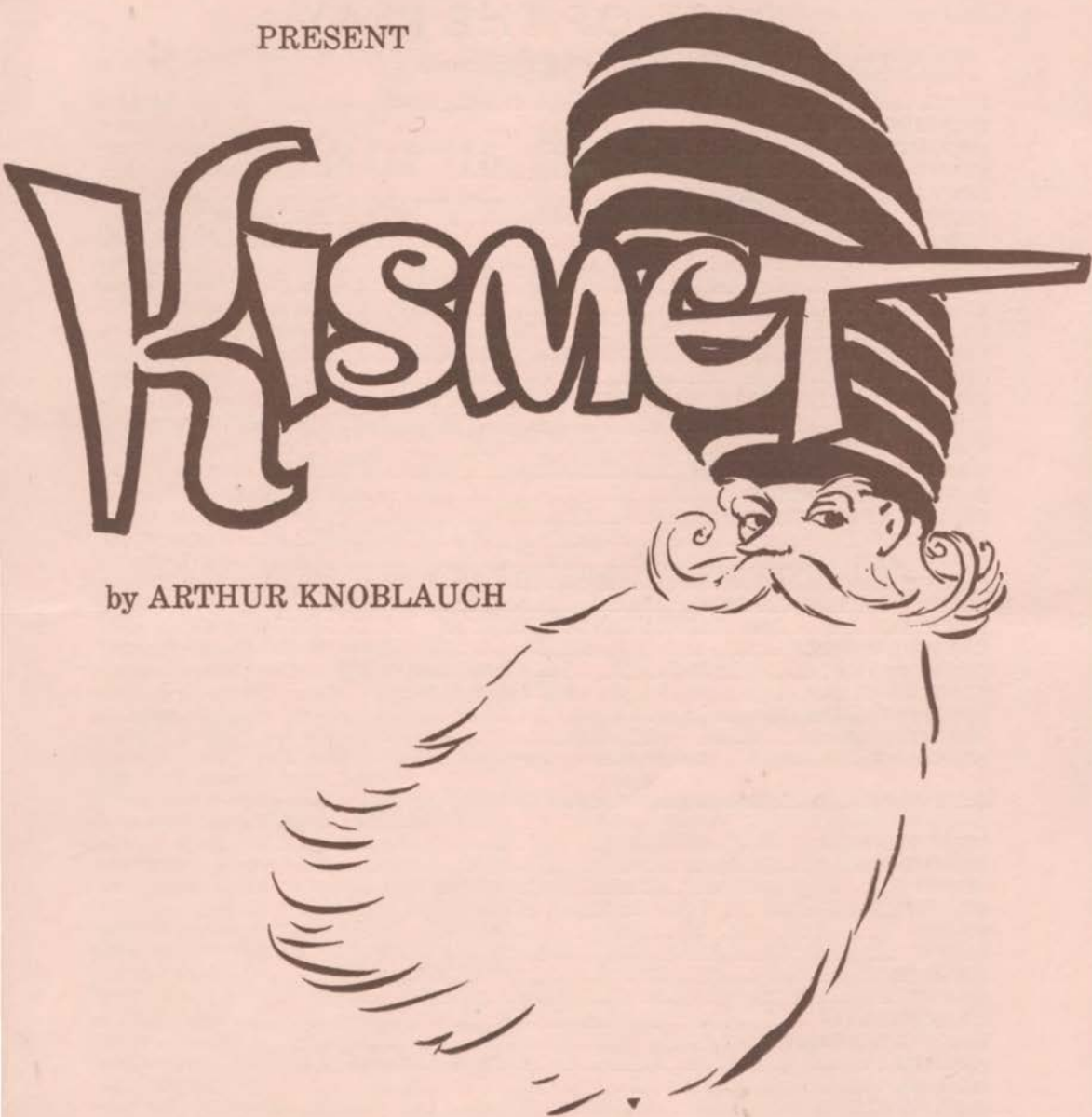

FOREST THEATRE--30th ANNIVERSARY

One pleasant day in 1909 a party of Mountaineers hiking from Chico found themselves, by mistake, coming down a steep trail to "Hidden Ranch," in the valley of Chico Creek. They asked permission to pause there for lunch; and when "Daddy" Paschall, the kindly rancher, noted that as they departed they left not a scrap of paper or other debris he was so greatly impressed that he made them his friends for life. In 1913, learning that the Mountaineers were seeking a site for a camp, he was instrumental in securing for them the 74-acre farm above him, which, with added acres, has been developed into the camp and rhododendron preserve of today.

Hilarious skits were often enacted around campfires, and some were put on to provide snapshots for our men overseas in 1917 and 1918.

Then in 1923 something really new in entertainment was initiated when a carefully rehearsed and costumed play, with both vocal and instrumental music, was presented to a hundred eager members far down in the deep woods, where the

ground was marshy and the mosquitos plentiful. Professional direction was secured for the play of 1924 and the following years. Then, just thirty years ago, in 1926, an audience of several hundred was led down a new trail to a new Forest Theatre, the present location, the site selected and the stage designed by William C. Darling.

By this time, others than Mountaineers were finding their way to the annual productions, and the players gradually began to realize that their project might mean more than entertainment for the members of the Club, that it might be considered a definite artistic and emotional contribution to community life.

By the time the Second World War interrupted the sequence, twenty annual productions had drawn thousands to our sylvan glade. Our Forest Plays were resumed in 1947, and now *Kismet* marks the thirtieth play in our long series, and the thirtieth year since the building of this present Forest Theatre.
