The Play

War has broken a family; Duke Frederick has claimed the Dukedom from his brother, the Duke Senior. Frederick has permitted his brother's daughter, Rosalind to remain as companion to his own daughter, Celia. Oliver, the eldest brother in a wealthy family, keeps his youngest brother, Orlando, poor and uneducated at home. Orlando can endure his servitude no longer. Oliver plots with Charles, the wrestler, to kill Orlando. Orlando meets and falls in love with Rosalind at the wrestling match, but flees to the Forest of Arden upon learning of the plot on his life. Duke Frederick, in a fit of anger, banishes Rosalind, who is accompanied by Celia to the forest of Arden in search of her father.

In Arden, the magic of romance drives the lovers, native and foreign, to a passionate discord. Faith and a little dose of magic resolves the lovers quarrels and restores harmony to all.

To me, *As You Like It* is about the magical change that happens inside all of us when we fall in love. Falling in love, like leaving home and walking in the forest, requires us to give up comforts, cast fears aside, and journey into the unknown. I have always found this to be an extremely dramatic event, such was the case with my new-born son. Why should it not be the case in theatre? The magical, invisible creatures living in Arden are Hymen. They can appear to mortals, but prefer to weave their magic and mischief unseen by those they manipulate. All those who enter Arden are affected by and must eventually confront Hymen. Must we not all have to confront the passions and humors of love? And are not the powers we attribute to a visit to the forest actually within ourselves?

Thank you for coming to the Forest of Arden.

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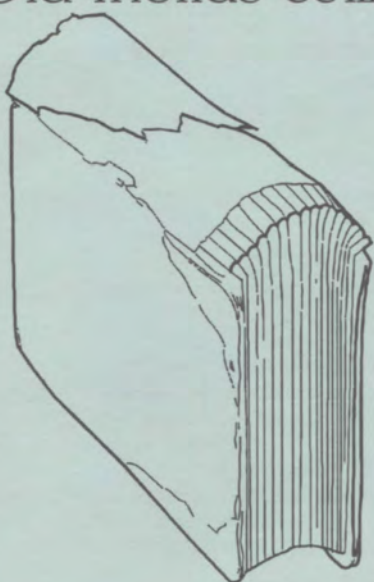
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
