# The Play

---

Matthew and Marilla Cuthbert of Green Gables decide to adopt an orphan boy to help Matthew with the farm chores. The orphanage sends a girl instead. Anne Shirley is talkative, red-headed and has an overactive imagination. She would have to go back, but the longer Anne is at the Green Gables, the more no one can imagine the place without her.

Anne is a girl with a lot of love to give who has never been given any herself. To me, this play is about how unconditional love breeds more love. **Anne of Green Gables** traces Anne's journey as she strives for love and acceptance.

Author Lucy Maud Montgomery wrote from her own experience. Her mother died when she was only three years old and she was raised by her grandparents in a farmhouse on Prince Edward Island. Many of Anne's misadventures were her own. (Maud actually did substitute liniment for vanilla in a cake she served to the minister!) When it first appeared in 1908, the book was an instant best-seller becoming required reading in many Canadian grammar schools. The series, ten in all, were hailed as an excellent depiction of life on the island. The house of Green Gables and the surrounding land are now a national park.

I'm sure you will all be as captivated as I was at age twelve when I first encountered **Anne of Green Gables**. Mark Twain said Anne, "was the sweetest creation of child life yet written."
