The book, *Anne of Green Gables*, has so many wonderful passages it is impossible to get them all into one play. Here is one of my favorites that I will slip into the program.

"...I'm going to imagine that I'm the wind that is blowing up there in those tree tops. When I get tired of the trees, I'll imagine I'm gently waving down here in the ferns – and then I'll fly over to Mrs. Lynde's garden and set the flowers dancing – and then I'll go with one great swoop over the clover field – and then I'll blow over the Lake of Shining Waters and ripple it all up into little sparkling waves. Oh, there's so much scope for the imagination in a wind."

One more point, we have added our own live theater special effects by way of introducing actors as Anne's imagination. Special effects in the movies can't match the magical interaction of live theater and your imagination.

Production Staff Profiles

Greg Brown has happily been doing sound for the Mountaineer Players since 1973. His other credits include Civic Light Opera, Pecosillo Players, and Upstage Productions.

Guy Caridi has been choreographing and performing dance since 1991, and for the Players since 2002. He has competed, coached and judged at national dance competitions, and taught and performed internationally. He has also choreographed numerous shows for local schools.

Mary Duckering has been involved with the Players in many capacities since 1970 and costumed many of the shows in the 1970s and 1980s. After a break, Mary has beautifully costumed the last six shows: *Music Man*, *State Fair*, *The Wizard of Oz*, *Oliver!*, *Peter Pan* and *Anne*.
