Tuck Everlasting is based on the 1975 book by Natalie Babbitt about a young girl, Winnie Foster, who yearns for adventure while living with her over-protective mother and grandmother in 1890’s New Hampshire. Winnie feels life is passing her by, so she runs away from home and meets young Jesse Tuck and his family – a family she soon realizes lives forever.

The Tuck family has forgotten how to enjoy and celebrate life. Because of their interaction with Winnie and her sense of adventure and excitement, the Tuck’s reconnect with life’s joys. Winnie must decide if she wants to wait until she is seventeen, drink the water and live with the Tuck family forever or return to her life in Tree Gap and live her limited mortal life.

Life is a series of individual moments that connect us with family, friends, joy and love. Winnie has to decide if it is more important to live each amazing moment of her life or to join the Tucks and have limitless moments.

My hope is that everyone watching this beautiful production will choose to live their lives loving and appreciating each moment as it happens. As Angus Tuck explains to Winnie, “Don’t be afraid of death, Winnie. Be afraid of not being truly alive. You don’t need to live forever, you just need to live.”

I can think of no more magical and wonderful place to present this enchanting story than this amazing theater in the woods. The cast and crew are phenomenal and have brought so much love and richness to the production. What an absolute delight it has been to have the opportunity to work with all of these people on such a unique and satisfying show.

BIG TREE TRAIL

One of the delights of the Mountaineers’ Kitsap Forest Theater is being surrounded by the Mountaineers Foundation Rhododendron Preserve – a 460 acre nature conservancy with over 70 acres of old-growth forest. Ancient western red cedars abound with many other trees, ferns and wildlife. One of the biggest trees on the Kitsap Peninsula is located on the preserve. The trail to ‘Big Tree’ is about 1/2 mile long and starts near the historic Kitsap Cabin, ending at one of the 10 largest Douglas Fir trees in the world (2nd largest in Kitsap County). The tree itself is over 30’ in diameter. The hike takes you on a bridge over Wildcat Creek with views of Hidden Valley, blooming trillium, wild rhododendrons and many other native trees and plants. You truly feel as if you have entered another world.

If you hike the trail after the show, please be sure your car is not blocking anyone in. Please note that the first part of the trail is steep – wear walking shoes and enjoy your trek into another time and place!
